Friday 6 February, 7pm, St Endellion Church (early start time!)

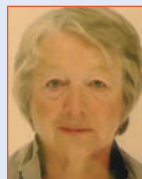
Truro Cathedral Choir

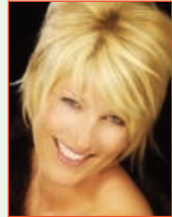
Saturday 23 May, 10am-3pm, St Endellion Church Singing workshop with Helen Porter

Poetry Workshop with Alyson Hallett

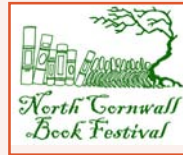
